

WHAT'S THE DAMAGE by Heather Phillipson

47st International Film Festival Rotterdam 24 January- 4 February 2018

International Film Festival Rotterdam (IFFR) presents the complete line-up of its Ammodo Tiger Short Competition, among which 14 world premieres. 22 films from all conceivable genres, from 18 different countries, and varying in length from 7 to 47 minutes, compete for 3 equal awards each worth €5,000.

Several of the selected filmmakers this year also feature in other IFFR sections. The world premiere of **The Worldly Cave** is a new work by Chinese artist Zhou Tao, to whom IFFR also dedicates an artist profile in its Deep Focus section. In the world premiere of his film **Glimpse**, Polish artist Artur Żmijewski allows images of refugees speak for themselves; IFFR also presents a comprehensive retrospective on Żmijewski's often thought-provoking films. **Tree Identification for Beginners** by **Yto** Barrada seamlessly connects with the PACT theme programme focusing on Pan-Africanism in cinema. And filmmaker **Maryam Tafakory** is represented with **Absent Wound**, but also screens two other short films in IFFR's Bright Future section.

This year's line-up seems decidedly politically engaged. Moria Al Qadiri, the only Dutch filmmaker shortlisted, combines childhood drawings, aliens and the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait in her imaginative **The Craft**. And British filmmaker Heather Phillipson takes on the patriarchy in her dazzling and provocative animated film **WHAT'S THE DAMAGE**.

The jury for the Ammodo Tiger Short Competition consists of Chinese filmmaker Ying Liang, Dutch graphic designer Mieke Gerritzen and Nigerian filmmaker Jim Chuchu, founder of The Nest Collective.

But the Ammodo Tiger Short Competition isn't the only place at IFFR to get your short film fix. The Bright Future Short and Voices Short programmes also contain a wide variety of short films that always find a way to touch, surprise or disturb their audiences. These are screened ahead of feature films, in short film compilations and in the annual short film marathon in KINO.

IFFR's Tiger Short Competition was recently renamed after its new partner Ammodo, an organisation supporting art and science; read all about it here. The awards will be presented on Sunday 28 January 2018.
