



IT&E donates \$3,600 to victims of Typhoons Rolly and Ulysses

IT&E Guam and CNMI raised a total of \$3,600 in company and subscriber donations for the victims of Typhoons Rolly and Ulysses in the Philippines. Funds raised will support relief efforts by local organizations.

IT&E held a text-to-donate campaign for both Guam and CNMI subscribers from November 18 to 26, 2020. IT&E matched subscriber donations in both regions, with \$1,000 raised in Guam to support relief efforts by the Filipino Community of Guam; and \$2,600 raised in the CNMI for relief efforts by the Office of the Philippine Honorary Consul to the CNMI Glicerio “Eli” Arago and the United Filipino Organization in the CNMI.

“Our hearts go out to those affected by these disasters.
