

John Williams And Wiener Philharmoniker Performance In Vienna Set For Immersive Dolby Atmos Music Release

Munich, Germany, August 13 2020: Dolby Laboratories (NYSE: DLB), a leader in immersive entertainment experiences, and leading classical music record label Deutsche Grammophon today announced the release of a special audio experience of legendary composer John Williams and the Wiener Philharmoniker's seminal performance – *John Williams Live in Vienna* – mixed in immersive Dolby Atmos sound will be available on Amazon Music HD and Blu-ray on August 14.

Williams' film scores span an impressive catalogue and have earned countless prestigious awards, including five Oscars, five Emmys, four Golden Globes and twenty-five Grammys. In what was Williams' continental Europe conducting debut, he was joined on stage at the world-renowned Vienna Musikverein by the Wiener Philharmoniker, as well as globally renowned violinist Anne-Sophie Mutter for performances of classic Williams' scores that had been specially adapted for her. These included "Hedwig's Theme" from the *Harry Potter* films, "Devil's Dance" from *The Witches of Eastwick* and the Theme from *Sabrina*.

The concert was recorded and mixed in Dolby Atmos by Bernhard Güttler.

John Williams commented: "Performing at such a prestigious venue as the Musikverein with the magnificent Wiener Philharmoniker and the incomparable Anne-Sophie Mutter was a very great privilege indeed. I'm delighted that listeners will be able to share that experience through the special technology of Dolby Atmos."
