Powered by PT6A-67A engines with dual oil coolers, the aircraft offers improved hot/high airfield performance as well as improvements in climb performance and cruising speeds. A factory extended utility nose capable of housing a variety of different sensors up to a 20-inch EO/IR sensor with a lift kit to retract them. The cockpit is compatible with Night Vision Imaging Systems (NVIS). Interior features include a mission rack with displays and a
