	<p>Visitors can purchase tickets at the museum or online. The museum encourages visitors to purchase tickets in advance online.</p>
<b>Living room for photography</b>	The ground floor will be an inviting meeting place with a library, museum shop, reception desk and Koffiebar Santos. Visitors are welcome here even without a ticket and can walk in freely. In this 'living room for photography', they can meet each other, have a drink, read, and watch the short film that Photographer of the Netherlands Marwan Magroun (Rotterdam, 1985) made especially for the reopening of the Nederlands Fotomuseum.
<b>Analog photo booth</b>	The ground floor will feature an authentic Photoautomat. This is an original analog photo booth. Visitors can have their picture taken (four photos in five minutes, price € 5, cash or contactless payment). The booth was built in England in the 1960s and restored to its original condition in Berlin as part of the Photoautomat project. The photobooth makes black and white photos.

<b>Koffiebar Santos</b>	On the ground floor is Koffiebar Santos, which serves a special Santos house blend, created in collaboration with a local coffee roaster, along with croissants and banana bread. The coffee bar is freely accessible to the public.
<b>Restaurant ZES</b>	On the sixth floor is restaurant ZES, offering panoramic views of the Rotterdam skyline. Visitors can enjoy sandwiches, salads, and wraps. Access to the restaurant is only possible with a museum ticket. From February until July 2026, the restaurant will be open Friday, Saturday and Sunday. After that, opening hours may change.
<b>Activities for young people</b>	During school holidays, there will be special workshops or activities planned.
<b>Activities for school groups</b>	The museum offers workshops for students of all ages. They are available in several languages.
