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Location

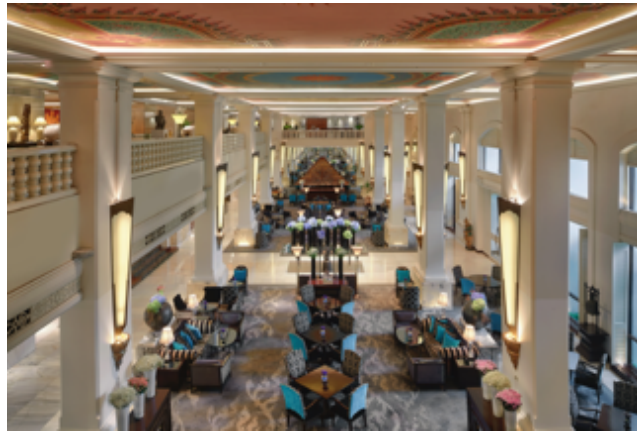
Anantara Siam is located in the heart of the Ratchadamri area, an upscale neighbourhood within central Bangkok, making it conveniently accessible to major shopping centres like CentralWorld, Siam Paragon, and MBK Center, as well as cultural sites such as the Erawan Shrine and Lumpini Park. The hotel also stands less than two minutes' walk from the Ratchadamri BTS Skytrain station, where trains whisk guests to the river in 20 minutes.

Ratchadamri is one of Bangkok's historic and prestigious areas, known for its upscale residences, embassies, and luxury hotels. The history of Ratchadamri Road and its surrounding neighbourhood dates back to the early 20th century, during the reign of King Rama V (King Chulalongkorn), who initiated

modern urban planning in Bangkok. Ratchadamri Road was constructed as part of his efforts to modernize the capital and improve transportation, connecting important areas of the city. Today, Ratchadamri is home to landmarks like the Royal Bangkok Sports Club, founded in 1901, which holds a prominent position as a members-only golf and sports club for Bangkok's elite.

Getting Here

Suvarnabhumi International Airport (BKK) is a 45-minute drive from the hotel and Don Muang International Airport (DMK) is only 25 minutes away. In addition to the hotel's Wi-Fi capable limousines, Anantara's fast track greeting service ensures a seamless experience.

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Iconic USP's

1. **The hotel is home to a secret garden hidden in the heart of the hotel, where one of Bangkok's best bars, AQUA is located.** Designed by local landscaper Sitthiporn Dhonavanik, the garden is home to 60 koi carp and an array of lush tropical plants originally sourced from Hawaii and the South Pacific. Since its inception more than 25 years ago, Aqua has established itself as an institution - an elegant escape in the heart of bustling Ratchaprasong and a popular haunt for Bangkok's elite.
2. **The resort is located in one of the most prestigious neighbourhoods in the Bangkok.** Guests are within walking distance of some of the city's best shopping malls, and biggest green space, Lumpini park. The hotel is also located directly opposite the century-old Royal Bangkok Sports Club, the most exclusive club in the country.
3. **The Grand Lobby features a hand-woven 100sqm Thai silk mural that took 12 months to complete.** Painstakingly painted by hand, by artist Ajarn Paiboon Suwannakudt, widely regarded as Thailand's greatest traditional muralist, of the modern era, the entire project, including the staircase mural, and the lobby's 25 ceiling panels, took Paiboon and his daughter 12 months to complete, with the assistance of 27 dedicated apprentices.
4. **It is arguably Bangkok's most iconic lobby and well regarded as 'lucky'.** Anantara Siam has been serving its legendary afternoon tea daily since 1983. Because of the ethereal murals depicting the cosmos overhead, the lobby is regarded as a 'lucky' and auspicious spot for signing contracts and making business deals.
5. **The hotel sits on royal land.** The surrounding land that the hotel is built on was once royal land, donated to the people of Siam by King Vajiravudh, in 1925.
6. **Guests can stay in a suite fit for a president.** The Explorer Suite by Jim Thompson was created to reflect a summer home, one that Jim Thompson, the famous silk merchant, might have worked on as a young architect. Unique furniture pieces were selected from antique markets, and the suite also features elements from the range of Jim Thompson furniture designed by world-renowned architect Ed Tuttle. Fabrics include some of the earliest silks as well as linen prints, demonstrating a history of Jim Thompson textiles. Famous guests include two US presidents: George W. Bush and Barack Obama.
7. **Guests can get inked by one of Thailand's most famous bamboo tattoo masters.** A bamboo tattoo, formally called Sak Yant, is one of the world's most ancient and sacred traditions. Anantara Siam is the only hotel in the kingdom that offers this exclusive private service by the revered master, Ajarn Neng.
8. **The resort is home to its own IV Drip Bar.** Located amidst the tropical gardens of Parichart Court, VIVID by Verita Health, is the perfect pit-stop for busy go-getters seeking instant cellular rejuvenation

9. **The hotel is pet friendly.** Dogs and cats are welcome to stay at Anantara Siam, and are permitted to peruse the Garden Terrace Patio and the Lobby. Each furry guest receives a special pet mat and bowls for food and water for extra comfort, as well as a surprise welcome gift!
 10. **At 6pm every day, guests can partake in the resort's iconic end of day ritual.** The sound of a traditional Thai gong can be heard ringing through our iconic lobby, marking the transition from day to night. The gong is one of the world's oldest instruments and occupies an important cultural significance, initiating rituals, expelling demons, and giving strength and courage. Following the gong, ladies in traditional Thai dress light the candles at the main entrance, illuminating the lotus ponds, while the lights around the hotel are switched on simultaneously.
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Top 5 Tips for an Unforgettable Stay

1. **Download the Anantara app.** This invites guests to tailor their stay in advance or from the comfort of their room, including seamlessly making reservations, arranging a last-minute laundry pick-up or even order a turndown at the click of a button.
 2. **Visit one of Bangkok's most loved bars.** Anantara Siam is home to Aqua, widely regarded as one of the city's best bars. Ask for Head Mixologist Ryan Germino by name, to serve you one of his special creations.
 3. **Book the champagne brunch at Parichart Court:** It's a Bangkok institution, and the most fabulous way to while away a Sunday in the city.
 4. **Take tea in the lobby.** Afternoon tea has been served in the iconic lobby every day since 1983 and has over the decades become a treasured institution for both Bangkok residents and tourists alike.
 5. **Snaffle a sausage roll.** The resort's café, Mocha & Muffins serves 60 of its famous sausage rolls every day with each being handcrafted by the in-house pastry team (even the sausage meat). Be quick as they sell out every day!

What's in a Name?

- Derived from the Sanskrit word meaning “without end”, the word “Anantara” embraces the excitement of discovery and the vibrant energy of new horizons.
- The name "Bangkok" comes from the Thai words "Bang" and "Ko(k)." Originally, "Bang" referred to a village or settlement along a river or waterway, and "Ko(k)" could mean "island" or "wild plum" tree. Thus, Bangkok likely referred to a "village on the river with wild plum trees." In its early days, Bangkok was a small trading post on the banks of the Chao Phraya River. However, the full ceremonial name of Bangkok is much longer and is actually recorded in the Guinness World Records as the longest place name in the world. This ceremonial name is: "*Krung Thep Maha Nakhon Amon Rattanakosin Mahinthara Ayuthaya Mahadilok Phop Noppharat Ratchathani Burirom Udomratchaniwet Mahasathan Amon Piman Awatan Sathit Sakkathattiya Witsanukam Prasit,*" which translates roughly to "City of Angels, Great City of Immortals, Magnificent City of the Nine Gems, Seat of the King, City of Royal Palaces, Home of the Gods Incarnate, Erected by Vishvakarman at Indra's Behest." Locally, Thai people refer to Bangkok as Krung Thep Maha Nakhon or simply Krung Thep, meaning the "City of Angels."
- "Siam" is the former name of Thailand, and it holds historical and cultural significance. The name "Siam" persisted until 1939, when the country officially changed its name to "Thailand" (Prathet Thai), which means "Land of the Free."



Architecture and Design

Anantara Siam Bangkok Hotel exemplifies a mesmerising fusion of traditional Thai architecture and contemporary luxury. Set amidst the bustling heart of downtown Bangkok, the hotel's inspiration came from a traditional Thai house, with two wings flanking the main building and lotus ponds bordering the main entrance. The three buildings are Parichart Court, Kannika Court and Monthathip Court, all named after Thai flowers.



Architecture

The hotel was designed by American architect George Wimberley, the founder of Wimberley, Allison, Whitsenand, Tong & Goo, arguably the world's most successful resort architect company. In collaboration with local architect Dan Wongprasart, the hotel was conceived as a 'residential' hotel combining the inspiration from Western classical grandeur that reached its pinnacle in the Edwardian age, as well as the profound spirituality of Thai Buddhist art, which blossomed in the Rattanakosin period. The hotel layout draws its theme from the individual units that comprise a traditional Thai house. The main core building is flanked by two atriums, each with corridors open to natural sunlight. Each of the two courts' landscaped tropical gardens gives the feeling of a lush rainforest.

Lobby and Ceiling Murals

The high-ceiling lobby is adorned with 25 subtle yet vibrant pastel mandala-type silk paintings covering every section of the ceiling. The ceiling mural, titled "The Heavens in Thai Thought," depicts the cosmos, and was created by the Thai artist Ajarn Paiboon Suwannakudt, also known as Tan Kudt. His work is revered for its cultural authenticity and its ability to bridge historical Thai themes with a modern setting.

Grand Staircase Mural

One of the hotel's most recognisable features is the grand staircase with its jaw-dropping 100sqm mural called 'The Coronation of a King', made entirely of hand-woven Thai silk and painstakingly painted by hand, by artist Ajarn Paiboon Suwannakudt, who was widely regarded as Thailand's greatest traditional muralist, of the modern era. The scene depicts the establishment of the new capital city of Bangkok and the beginning of the Chakri dynasty, following the execution of King Taksin during a coup d'état which brought an end to the Thonburi dynasty, in 1782. This project was Ajarn Paiboon's last work, who regretfully, never got to see the finished masterpiece; he passed away just six months into the project. However, his daughter Khun Phaptawan, shared the same passion for traditional art (and indeed the same talent) as her father, and committed to finish the job he started. The entire project, including the staircase mural and the lobby's 25 ceiling panels, took the pair 12 months to complete, with the assistance of 27 dedicated apprentices.

Rooms

Designed by Jeffrey A. Wilkes of LTW Designworks, who is recognised for his ability to blend cosmopolitan influences with tradition, the interiors of the Rooms and Suites infuse a contemporary aesthetic, greeting guests with a subtle Thai character remaining true to the ethos of the Anantara brand. Using elegant regional undertones, typical Asian details are eschewed with the design, paying homage to Thai palaces that have been constructed with European influences. Thai silk has been used as wall panels to give a simple and elegant finish, a refined reflection of Thailand, and an antique map of Bangkok in the Deluxe rooms provides an interesting conversation piece.

Parichart Court

Designed by local landscaper, Sitthiporn Dhonavanik, an esteemed pioneer in the realm of botany in Thailand, Parichart Court is an outdoor courtyard, a welcome respite within the bustling city. The architecture reflects a fusion of colonial and traditional Thai influences, with archways, high ceilings, and clean lines that create a sense of openness and elegance. Sitthiporn travelled extensively, to distant lands including the South Pacific and Hawaii, sourcing a diverse array of unique plants, and later cultivating them in his nursery near Pattaya, before relocating them to our courtyard oasis. Today, visitors at Anantara

Siam Hotel can witness the beauty of his legacy as they wander through the courtyard garden, still rich with some of the exotic flora and fauna he so lovingly nurtured four decades ago. The waterfall features boulders transported from the River Khwae, more commonly known as the River Kwai, a river in western Thailand, infamous for its role in World War II.

Sustainability Credentials

Locally sourced seafood. All of the resort's seafood is locally sourced from a farm located in Chachoengsao, comprising a collective of local fishermen dedicated to sustainable aquaculture. Practices prioritise environmental health and community engagement.

Community collaborations. The resort's welcome amenity programme has been crafted in collaboration with local suppliers. Chocolate for example is from cocoa farms in Chonburi and Rayong and each chocolate bar is elegantly wrapped in specially designed paper that reflects the artistic motifs of our Grand Staircase.

Dollars for Deeds: Anantara's Dollars for Deeds programme gives guests the option to donate one dollar (THB 30) per night of their stay, with Anantara matching each guest's contribution. The funds raised are donated to three worthwhile foundations: the Golden Triangle Asian Elephant Foundation (GTAEF) in Chiang Rai, the Mai Khao Turtle Foundation in Phuket and the Princess Sirindhorn Craniofacial Centre at Chulalongkorn Hospital in Bangkok.



Stays: Rooms and Suites

354 rooms and suites provide authentic, comfortable luxury. Blending traditional Thai and contemporary style, the charm of Thai artefacts, teak furnishings and silk fabrics is matched by refreshing views of the lush gardens and activity park of Royal Bangkok Sports Club. Beautifully appointed rooms feature a plush bedroom and a marble bathroom with a deep tub and separate glass enclosed shower. Some also feature a private entrance with white columns and Thai statues, and a dining patio overlooking the pool and a lotus pond.
