The hotel

In the heart of Valencia, between leafy trees and busy streets, stands [NH Collection Valencia Colón](#). The building, constructed between 1870 and 1880, was previously home to the headquarters of the Department of Economy, Industry, Tourism and Commerce of the Generalitat Valenciana. Featuring a rococo architectural style with imperialist nuances, it was, in a previous life, a palatial dwelling. To the rear, its patio is framed by a classical façade with semicircular arches, surrounded by pilasters and pediments that underline its historic grandeur. The hotel stands out among its neighbouring buildings like a work of art by Valencian painter Sorolla.

NH Collection hotels are characterised by exceptional locations and, on 34 Colón Street, this property stays true to the brand's form. The Plaza del Ayuntamiento, the Central Market, Los Jardines del Turia and the Plaza de la Virgen are barely more than 10 minutes away on foot. In the distance, the City of Arts and Sciences looms on the horizon.

The entrance pays tribute to the American Art Deco movement and Prohibition-era nightclubs. The inimitable style of the Roaring Twenties is reflected in the oak wood panelling, stained black and inlaid with mirrors in a pattern repeated to the high ceiling, creating an imposing first impression.

The 1920s inspiration continues in the piano lounge, which leads to the dining room. The main room resembles a New York club, with large tufted sofas, fireplaces in pairs, and dynamic mixes of fabrics and textures. The winter room extends into a conservatory reminiscent of summer rooms in Victorian country houses. Geometric patterned upholstery stands out against the green hues of the walls, which are decorated with latticed-framed mirrors.

Accommodation, services and facilities

The hotel's 47 rooms were designed by noted decorator Lorenzo Castillo, who was inspired by countries around the world. The English room is accented with velvet in a warm palette of golden ochres; porthole mirrors

adorn the walls and the bed features a Georgian headboard. The Indian room pays homage to the Taj Mahal and its colours, mixing white and blue on its marble walls. The French room stars a *polonaise* four-poster bed and gray and white furniture with gold accents.

The hotel boasts a solarium, gym and eight private parking spaces, and offers guests the option of late check-out and early check-in, subject to availability.

Gastronomic offerings

Kamikaze Restaurant, also decorated by designer Lorenzo Castillo, stands out for its calm and relaxed atmosphere. The menu combines the culinary avant-garde with authentic Mediterranean flavours. Among its delicacies are steak tartare with grilled bone marrow and cured egg yolk; grilled red mullet with red shrimp suquet; and lamb shank, sweet potatoes and shallots in Port. Irresistible desserts include a cheesecake with toasted egg yolk.

After dinner, Kamikaze Piano Club awaits diners for a nightcap. At this British-colonial-style drinking destination, guests will find a 13-foot grand piano, an award-winning bartender who prepares signature cocktails, and a wide selection of wines. For those who prefer to sip drinks al fresco, the Kamikaze Terrace Sky Bar is located on the hotel's roof with live music performances to elevate any evening.
